About College

The Nongstoin College is a Co-educational Institution which was set up by a group of sensible and enlightened persons of Nongstoin on 1st August, 1978. It is located at the District Headquarter of West Khasi Hills, Meghalaya. The Nongstoin Syiemship was initially the sponsoring Body of the College. A year later, the Nongstoin Youth Welfare Organisation (NYWO) took over from the Syiem of Nongstoin. This is a Premier College in the West Khasi Hills District of Meghalaya. It is now Permanently Affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University, Shillong and granted with a Deficit status from the Government of Meghalaya since April 1996. It was included under 2 (f) and 12-B of the UGC Act. 1956 in December, 2005.

Initially, the College functioned at the Block Information Centre, West Khasi Hills. In April, 1984, the College shifted to a hired building of Dr. S. Dkhar at New Nongstoin. With the acquisition of land by the Nongstoin Youth Welfare Organisation (NYWO) at Nongpyndeng, the College has been functioning at this beautiful permanent site since January, 1994. It is about 5km (by road) from the heart of the Town and well connected by public Transport system. The Motto of the College is “Learn to Serve”. The College was accredited by NAAC with B Grade.

Vision:

- To in still a spirit of full commitment and devotion among students at the mental and spiritual level so that they become good citizens who would serve the society as enshrined with our motto.
- To produce leaders who will be agents of social change, primarily among the communities they live in, so that they can contribute to the nation as a whole; by providing quality human resource, intellectually sound, ethically sensitive and socially compassionate graduates.

Mission:

- To promote social unity, religious tolerance and community development to Foster national Integration with a thrust on achieving academic ambience.
- Our Mission is to achieve the vision of the founder by establishing and managing educational institutions based on the four cardinal principles of discipline, sound education, sports & service.

- To develop sound sportsmanship by promoting sports and games.

- To make students leaders, entrepreneurs and job-creators not job seekers; and
- To equip them to face any challenge, anywhere, with self-confidence and self-discipline.

Academic Instruction

1. Students are to follow the Examination Rules laid down by the NEHU (ordinance) during the Examination as printed on the reverse of the Admit Card strictly.
2. Academic Examination is mandatory for all Students.
3. Identity card is mandatory for students and to produce it if asked for at any time
4. All Annual Fees (and University Enrolment Fee for Degree) are to be paid at the time of Admission.
5. English is a Compulsory Language for communication inside the College Campus.
6. A minimum of 75% attendance is required for each subject in every Semester
7. The College Authority recognizes the danger of one’s health in the use of tobacco Products, Hard Drugs and Alcohol. Therefore, these bad habits are strictly prohibited in and around the College Campus. Violation of this rule will subject to Heavy Fine/Expulsion.
8. Breakage of any article material like Furniture, Glass Panes, Doors and Windows etc., of the College premises, the cost of which will be realized from concerned student at the prevailing market price.
9. Duplicate Identity card will be issued only in genuine cases on payment of prescribed fee.
10. It is the responsibility of all the students to see that Cleanliness is maintained inside the class room and within the Campus. One must not throw any rubbish or do anything to deface the building or the ground.
11. Students who do not co-operate with the College authorities in enforcement of discipline and who do not show evidence of regular attendance and seriousness in studies are liable to be struck off the rolls of the College after watching their behaviour for two months.
12. Any student found misusing, disturbing the atmosphere of the College, he/she is liable to be penalised accordingly.
13. Using of foul language is prohibited.
14. Eve teasing is Punishable under law.
15. Students should wear decent dress when coming to College.

Criteria for Admission:

The application form for admission will be issued irrespective of caste or creed to the different Streams if one has passed Class XII Examination from the recognized Board. Forms are available at the College office on Payment.

Admission Procedures:

1. Attested Copy of Mark sheet& Certificate of Class X and class XII
2. Two Passport Size Photographs.
3. Passed-cum-Character Certificate from the Head of Institution last attended (for students coming from other Institutions).
4. Character Certificate from the Headman (for students coming from other Institution).
5. Schedule Tribe / OBC Certificate
6. Migration Certificate (to be submitted by student passing from other Board / University only after getting permission from the Principal).

N.B.: The College Authority reserves the right to refuse an admission without assigning any reason.

Internal Evaluation System:

- Internal Evaluation under Semester system is based as per NEHU guidelines
- For Arts and Commerce, Internal Test (15 marks) and Assignments (10 marks). For Internal Test, the students are to sit for three tests as mentioned in the 'Academic Schedule'.
- For Science students (Honours & Electives) Theory Internal assessment (19 marks) Test 10 marks, assignment 9marks;practicalInternal assessment (6marks)
- For students taking Geography (Honours & Electives) Theory Internal assessment (19 marks) Test 10 marks, assignment 9marks;practicalInternal assessment (6marks)
- For students taking DTP (elective), internal test(12 marks), practical (12 marks)

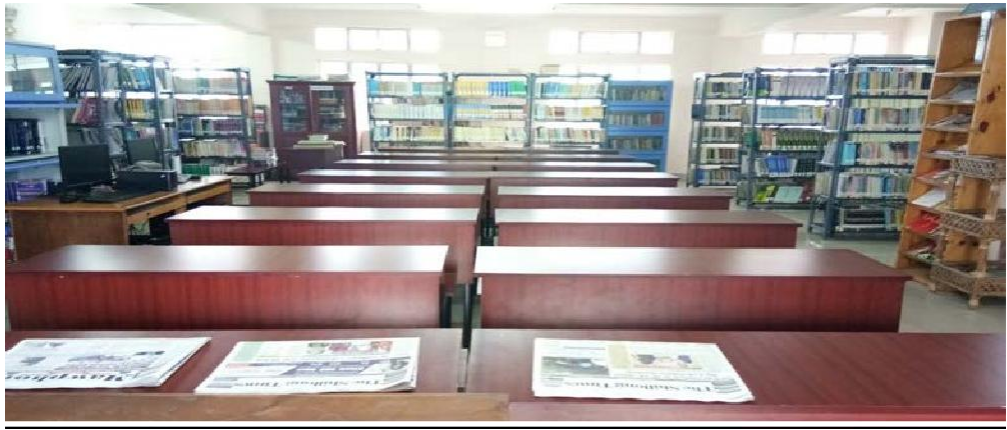

University Rules and Regulation

- Any Students who could not attend 75% of Classes in any semester will not be allowed to appear in their respective Semester Examination.
- Examination and evaluation shall be conducted according to the Ordinances / Regulations of the University.
- A students shall be declared successful with “Honours” if he/she passes (i.e. obtain at least 30% marks) in all Compulsory Courses / Papers as specified for the subjects (s) concerned, securing at least 45% marks in the Elective Honours Papers in aggregate, i.e. all Honours Papers taken together (from I to VI Semesters) and as stipulated in the relevant (revised) NEHU Ordinances (OC-8).
- A students shall be declared successful with “Simple pass” if he/she passes (i.e. obtain at least 30% marks) in all Compulsory Courses / Papers as specified for the subjects (s) concerned, securing not less than 33% but less than 45% marks in the Honours Papers in aggregate, i.e. all Elective Honours Papers taken together (from I to VI Semesters) and as stipulated in the relevant (revised) Ordinances (OC-8). Thus at the UG level, the University shall declare two types of successful students as per the following table:-

However, the student must secure not less than 33% but less than 45% marks in the Honours Papers all taken together. These percentages (i.e. 33% and 45%) will be computed at the End Semester.

- A student shall have to clear the Degree within 5 (five) academic years or 10 (ten) Semesters.
- Students are eligible to proceed to the next Semester Course, regardless of passing or failing in any one or more subject of the first five end Semester Examination (s). Such candidates will be required to appear and pass the failed (or within 5 years) during Regular Semesters.
- Students appearing for improvement examination will be required to appear after completion the regular semester governed under the same provision but required to surrender their original mark sheet. Marks obtained consequent upon improvement examination will be retained.
